Registered General Nurses (RGNs)

Applicants who apply for screening must meet the following **essential** requirements:

- Successful completion of secondary school education which is a separate schooling from one's nursing education.
- Successful completion of a government-approved and accredited general nursing degree program (First Class) or equivalent of NLT 3 years study duration which covered a minimum number of hours of theoretical instruction in:
 - a) Nursing Care of the Adult (which includes Medical and Surgical Nursing)
 - b) Maternal/Infant Nursing (excluding Gynaecology)
 - c) Nursing Care of Children (Paediatrics)
 - d) Psychiatric/Mental Health Nursing (excluding Neurology)
- Proficiency in English language equal or equivalent to TOEFL 196 cpt/525 pbt in reading, writing and listening, and equal or equivalent to TOEFL 213 cpt/550 pbt in conversational English. Evidence of recent assessment must also be provided.
- Completion of not less than one year's working experience in any one or more of the following specialty practice areas: a. older people care; b. short-term rehabilitation care; c. assisted living; d. long-stay custodial care; and e. hospice care. See Application Form – www.iiccc.info.
- Completion of not less than two years post graduate working experience in an acute care hospital.
- Furnish copy of Valid/Current National Licence, including certificates in psychiatric nursing or in respect of specialty disciplines, as applicable.
- Furnish copies of nursing training curricula, catalogues, etc
- Provide social security number or equivalent.
- Be prepared to undertake a diagnostic examination or test, if required.
- Be prepared to take an oral examination after passing a written licensure examination.
- Be prepared to undertake Finger Print Card process
- A genuine desire to work and live abroad
- Pass a CORI check prior to offer of employment or participation on PCP.

N.B. It would be a distinct advantage to have recently passed NCLEX-RN or equivalent; to have met the required TOEFL standard or equivalent; to have not less than four years post graduate working experience in an acute care hospital; not less than two years working experience in any one or more of the specialty practice areas listed above; to provide evidence of not less than one year's demonstrated leadership; and current certification in IV Therapy, BLS, ACLS or PALS relevant to areas of specialty.

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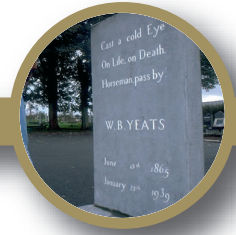
Physiotherapists (PTs)

Applicants who apply for screening **must** meet the following **essential** requirements:

- a. A Bachelor's degree in Physiotherapy (NLT 3 years syllabus) awarded by an educational institution recognised as such by the Ministry of Education/Health in the country of issuance.
- b. Current National Licence or membership in a recognised international agency.
- c. Proficiency in English language equal or equivalent to TOEFL 196 cpt/525 pbt in reading, writing and listening, and equal or equivalent to TOEFL 213 cpt/550 pbt in conversational English. Evidence of recent assessment must also be provided.
- d. Include with application for screening a self-reported, typewritten summary of supervised clinical experiences to include:
 - Dates and number of clock hours of each supervised clinical experience.
 - Type of facility in which each supervised clinical experience took place.
 - Overall focus of each supervised clinical experience (e.g. orthopaedics, paediatrics, geriatrics, medical-surgical, etc.)
 - Approximate number of patients cared for during supervised clinical experiences, in each of the following age ranges: 0–18, 19–55, 56 and over.
 - **N.B.** Not less than two years post graduate work experience as a Physiotherapist in a large hospital in relevant experience with patients with same diagnosis seen in acute care hospitals or Rehabilitation Facilities.

- e. Meet minimum credit requirements in General Education, Foundation Sciences, Clinical Sciences, and Clinical Education
- f. Provide social security number or equivalent
- g. Be prepared to take an oral examination after passing a written licensure examination.
- h. Pass a CORI check prior to offer of employment or participation on PCP.
- i. Be prepared to undertake Finger Print Card process.

N.B. It would be a distinct advantage to have recently passed NPTE or equivalent; to have met the required TOEFL standard or equivalent; to have not less than four years post graduate work experience as a Physiotherapist in a large hospital in relevant experience with patients with same diagnosis seen in acute care hospitals or Rehabilitation Facilities. Wide background is preferred e.g. ICU, acute medical/surgical, paediatric, geriatric etc; to provide evidence of not less than one year's demonstrated leadership; and a Master's degree in PT with at least five years relevant work experience.





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Occupational Therapists (OTs)

Applicants who apply for screening **must** meet the following **essential** requirements:

- a. A Bachelor's degree in Occupational Therapy (NLT 3 years syllabus) awarded by an educational institution recognised as such by the Ministry of Education/Health in the country of issuance and by the WFOT as an institution approved to grant such a degree(s).
- b. Current National Licence or membership in a recognised international agency.
- c. Proficiency in English language equal or equivalent to TOEFL 196 cpt/525 pbt in reading, writing and listening, and equal or equivalent to TOEFL 213 cpt/550 pbt in conversational English. Evidence of recent assessment must also be provided.
- d. Include with his/her application for screening a self-reported, typewritten summary of supervised clinical experiences to include:
 - Details of supervised clinical fieldwork including the name and credentials of the supervisor of the occupational therapy fieldwork; the number of hours/weeks of each experience; and the types of clients treated. See Application Form – www.iiccc.info
 - **N.B.** Not less than two years post graduate work experience as an Occupational Therapist in a large hospital in relevant experience with patients with same diagnosis seen in acute care hospitals or Rehabilitation Facilities.
- e. Meet minimum credit requirements in General Education, Foundation Sciences, Clinical Sciences, and Clinical Education
- f. Provide social security number or equivalent
- g. Be prepared to take an oral examination after passing a written licensure examination.
- h. Pass a CORI check prior to offer of employment or participation on PCP.
- i. Be prepared to undertake Finger Print Card process

N.B. It would be a distinct advantage to have recently passed NBCOT or equivalent; to have met the required TOEFL standard or equivalent; to have not less than four years post graduate work experience as an Occupational Therapist in a large hospital in relevant experience with patients with same diagnosis seen in acute care hospitals or Rehabilitation Facilities; and to provide evidence of not less than one year's demonstrated leadership; and a Master's degree in OT with at least five years relevant work experience.

Licensure validation – RGNs/PTs/OTs

The licensure review is an evaluation of all licenses issued to the applicant, including initial, current, and past registrations, licences, certifications etc. The screening board may require an issuing/validating institution to forward validations directly to it in order to affirm that the applicant has completed the necessary practice requirements and that the registration/licensure has not been suspended or revoked.
